

Population structure in 2008 and 2060



- Great diversity across
 EU, both for present and future, reflecting political and social history.
- 3 main factors are shaping the pyramid: births, deaths and migration
- Old-age dependency ratio (65+ in relation to 15-64) to be shifted from 0,25 (= 4 people 15-64 per each 65+) today to 0,53 in 2060 (= 2 people 15-64 per each 65+)

Development of services

- EU 2007 benchmarking: average sophistication maturity level = 76% (transactional)
- 5th level of services: Personalisation
 - indicates fully integrated electronic procedures, front and back office integration, and re-use of available data. Alternatives:
 - **1. Pro-active service delivery** = service delivery quality; e.g. warning about action, pre-filling data etc.
 - **2. Automatic service delivery** = no need for the user to request
 - EU average on 5th level: 36%
- Redesign of service provisioning: CzechPoint
