





Healthcare Provider IT Spending in CEE, 2010


Is it spending money on IT?


Source	Definition
World Health Organization	eHealth is the transfer of health resources and healthcare by electronic means.
European Commission-DG Information Society and Media	eHealth means the use of modern information and communication technologies (ICT) in support of health and health-related fields to meet needs of citizens, patients, healthcare professionals, healthcare providers, and policy makers.
Research Houses	In 1999 ehealth was used to refer to healthcare organization's web presence, now it is often used to refer to the act of a consumer/citizen going online to obtain health information.



Source	Definition
CIO of a large university hospital in Central and Eastern Europe	"eHealth means mobile health, the ability to monitor patients in their homes."
IT Director at a mid-sized research-focused hospital in Central and Eastern Europe	"I suppose it can mean the extension of rational use of computers in everyday life into healthcare."
IT Director at a mid-sized hospital in Central and Eastern Europe	"eHealth is a political term, it means nothing."




Can ehealth help the Slovak healthcare system?


