


Cybercrime, Cybersecurity and fundamental rights

Parallel Internet? (Shengen-net? China-net? TLDx-net?)


- a part of the Internet with additional safe-guards built-in

- not a subject to the jurisdiction of any security or service agencies












The Internet was not intended to be that hierarchical







What if the internet would be structured along social graphs?




