2003: the estimated savings


A general budgetary analysis of **public payments found** a total efficiency potential of € 100 mill./year:

- Elimination of float-days € 25 mill./year
- Closing of cash tills € 15 mill./year
- Easy Account € 30 mill./year
- E-Invoicing € 30 mill./year
 - 15 million invoices/year
 - Estimated €2 reduction in handling cost pr. invoice

Legislation

- *Public Payment Act* was passed in December 2003
- Regulation was necessary: The public sector and all companies had to be committed in order to ensure critical mass
- By February 2005 all invoices to the public sector had to be sent electronically
 - only structured invoices
 - no exceptions







What to do!



- In 2008 NemHandel (EasyTrade) was introduced
- NemHandel is an open, shared and yet secure infrastructure using the internet.
- There is only one central component the NemHandel registry
- NemHandel makes room for solutions that meet the different needs and IT skills of both small and large companies
- NemHandel is based on open standards and it contains guidelines and open source components that makes it easy for it-vendors to implement.
 - The easier and cheaper it is the more it-solutions will be offered.



Mandatory since May 2011

All public authorities are now registered in the NemHandels registry with their unique ID (GS1 GLN). The NemHandel registry is PEPPOL complient.

A wide range of e-invoicing solutions are being offered, a lot of new players have emerged

Fully integrated in ERP system

Partly integrated in ERP system

-using an email program to send the invoices.

Or using a web-based invoice form

- several in the market, and one run by us

We are seeing an increased use business to business



E-procurement – post award

-Focus now on e-Procurement as opposed to e-invoicing
-The aim is to digitalize and make the end-to-end process from procurement to invoice and payment more effective
- Based on an international standard (UBL 2.0)



Electronic Procurement & Financial Systems



...And NOW the SMEs benefit – they get paid faster, sometimes within days, and they can invoice their private customers using the same system! SME benefits

The Work and ideas behind NemHandel have been fed into CEN and PEPPOL and altered to meet cross border European needs

any company in the EU can communicate electronically with any EU governmental agency for all procurement processes

The PEPPOL project




- Pilot A objective: Enabling EU-wide public eProcurement
- 50% EU contribution for achieving interoperability
- Coordinated by the Norwegian Agency for Public Management and eGovernment (Difi)
- Consortium and scope:
 - 18 beneficiaries from 11 countries
 - Total budget 30,8 M€
 - 8 work packages, <1.600 person months and 10 M€ on sub-contractors
 - Project start up: 1 May 2008, duration 52 months*



Connecting eProcurement Islands









Results so far after 4 years with PEPPOL

- 17 beneficiaries are participating and have connected their national infrastructures
- Another 12 countries wants to join and more will follow...
- More than 250.000 unique public organisations are connected
- 350.000+ subcontractors and economic operators are connected.
- 80 commercial service providers are connect
 - (- EC estimates that by 1. jan 2012 there was 500 service providers in Europe)
- Scandinavien is strong represented by the Swedish, Norwegian and







- From a Danish perspective
 - NemHandel is now connected to PEPPOL
 - More than 130.000 private Danish companies are connected
 - More than 34.000 unique public contracting authorities are connected
 - More than 10 private service providers have signed the PEPPOL Transport Infrastructure Agreements (TIA) with DIGST
 - NemHandel infrastructure is now slowly merging over to the common European (PEPPOL/CEN/OASIS) standards












Collaboration landscape

- OpenPEPPOL AISBL
 - Long term sustainability through user driven governance
 - An entity by the users for the users
- Continued cooperation between Member States and EU
 - Short term plans: Further development and implementation of eProcurement building blocks in new Pilot A (BCSS / e-SENS), ISA operations
 - Medium term plans: Connecting Europe Facility (CEF)
- Continued Standardisation
 - CEN initiatives on eProcurement business process standardisation including eInvoicing
 - OASIS/other initiatives on eDelivery/Document Transport Infrastructure
