






Vendor lock-in

Open Standards

- adopted and maintained by a not-for-profit organisation, open decision-making procedures (consensus)
- published specifications are freely available
- possible patents are irrevocably made available on a royalty-free basis
- no constraints for the reuse of the standard





Free Software

- freedom to unlimited use
- freedom to study & modify (*)
- freedom to copy & redistribute
- freedom to improve & distribute (*)

(*) requires source code















Testcase: Free Software

- Open Standards are really open if implemented in Free Software
- ODF: OpenOffice, Koffice, AbiWord, ...
- HTML: Mozilla Firefox, Konqueror, ...
- SIP: Ekiga Softphone
- Jabber: Gaim, Kopete, ...
- PNG, OGG, SCORM, IMS LD, PDF, HTTP, TCP/IP





Why are we not using it?

Factors holding back the adoption of Free Software:

- lack of awareness
- perceived lack of (internal) technical support
- lack of qualified teachers
- lack of educational and training materials (fragmentation)






