Are outpatient clinics sufficiently protected? (hall Grand B2)

The presentation is based on a questionnaire survey conducted on a statistically significant sample of respondents, including a large number of outpatient clinics in Slovakia. Based on the collected data, we will present information and communication architectures as they are actually used in the outpatient sector—from the simplest practices with minimal IT equipment to networked clinics using cloud services, wireless infrastructure, and medical electronics. We will identify typical categories of outpatient clinics according to their level of IT complexity and demonstrate how increasing complexity changes the clinics' security profile and related cybersecurity risks. The presentation will also explain why there is no single universal security recommendation for all outpatient clinics and why measures to protect processed data must always be tailored to the specific IT environment. The conclusions of the presentation will serve as a foundation for a follow-up Masterclass focused on practical and targeted security recommendations for individual types of outpatient clinics.

However, in the context of an open European market, parallel trade flows and stock movements within the EU naturally enter into national strategies. The panel will focus on what a modern and balanced national medicines policy should look like: where is the optimal balance between free-market principles and guaranteeing access to treatment for domestic patients.
