

What standard can encourage interoperability and competition?

 A standard that - based on the charter - has to be compatible with one particular application from one vendor:

ECMA TC45 Charter: "Produce a standard which is fully compatible with the Office Open XML Formats"

or

 A standard that was designed to be vendor and application independent?



ODF Design Goals

Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this TC is to create an open, XML-based file format specification for office applications.

The resulting file format must meet the following requirements:

- it must be suitable for office documents containing text, spreadsheets, charts, and graphical documents,
- it must be compatible with the W3C Extensible Markup Language (XML)
 v1.0 and W3C Namespaces in XML v1.0 specifications,
- 3. it must retain high-level information suitable for editing the document,
- it must be friendly to transformations using XSLT or similar XML-based languages or tools,
- it should keep the document's content and layout information separate such that they can be processed independently of each other, and
- it should 'borrow' from similar, existing standards wherever possible and permitted.



ODF starts a new game with new rules that lets everybody participate

ISO/IEC 26300



Defined in an open, transparent process

- Mailing lists open to the public
- Individual members allowed
- Public meeting agendas and minutes
- Received public comments are publicly visible




Open Document Format for Office Applications (OpenDocument) v1.0





A long tradition of openness

Year	Events / Milestones
1999	Development of an XML file format begins at StarDivision, Sun acquires StarDivision
2000	Foundation of the OpenOffice.org project, foundation of an XML community project
2002	First collaboration with the KDE/KOffice project, first OASIS ODF TC conference call, OpenOffice.org 1.0 / StarOffice 6 released with OpenOffice.org XML file format support
2003	KOffice decides to use ODF as its default file format
2005	ODF approved as OASIS standard, OpenOffice.org 2.0 / StarOffice 8 released with ODF support, ODF submitted to ISO, Sun issues patent covenant statement, Softmaker releases Textmaker 2006 with ODF support
2006	IBM releases IBM Workplace with ODF support, ODF Alliance founded, KOffice with ODF default file format released, ODF Adoption TC founded, ISO approves ODF as ISO/IEC 26300
